# Key Stage 1

Maths Activity – Active Geometry Task

Literacy Activity - Create an invite to the FIFA Women's World Cup

Creative Activity – Get to know the FIFA Women's World Cup Mascot or Design your own kit







### **Active Maths Geometry Task**

This task can be complete as a class or in small groups, for example with an LSA or teacher.

#### You will need:

A good length of string - long enough for everyone in the group to hold with 2 hands Or Chalks - to draw on the playground

Shape Cards below – Circle, Square, Triangle, Rectangle

#### Task with string

You are going to create different shapes which could be medal shapes for the FIFA Women's Football World Cup. We are going to try and make a medal in the shape of a circle, a square, a triangle and a rectangle.

Show the group one of the shape cards. With your whole group holding on to the string can you re-create the following shapes:

#### Circle Square Triangle Rectangle

Year 2 Extension task

Can you make a hexagon shape.

With another piece of string or a different colour wool can you show any lines of symmetry.

#### Or Task with chalk

Show the group one of the shape cards.

Using the chalk can you draw the following shapes on the playground:

Circle Square Triangle Rectangle


#### Year 2 Extension task

Using chalk can you mark on in a different colour any lines of symmetry.









A circle's like a ball. A circle's like a ball. Round and round it never stops, A circle's like a ball.








A square is like a box. A square is like a box. It has four sides; they're all the same A square is like a box.



A triangle has three sides. A triangle has three sides. Up the mountain, down, and baCk, A triangle has three sides.








A rectangle has four sides. A rectangle has four sides. Two are short and two are long, A rectangle has four sides.

## This summer the FIFA Women's Football World Cup Finals are taking place in Australia and New Zealand.


AIM: To introduce pupils to 'TAZUNI' the Penguin is the Mascot for the finals.
